About Tonight's Music

There is a wealth of music specifically composed to create atmosphere or accompany the action of a play or a film and tonight we present a programme with examples from three centuries.

The 17th century is represented by Purcell's Rondeau. Abdelazer or The Moor's Revenge by Aphra Behn was first performed in 1676. Purcell wrote incidental music for a London revival in 1695. The rondeau is perhaps best known as the theme in Britten's Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra.

From the 19th century we have Mendelssohn's music for Shakespeares 'Midsummer Night's Dream' (1842) and Bizet's music for Daudet's play 'L' Arlésienne' (1872). In the latter case the music has outlived the play which closed after only 21 performances.

The early 20th century saw the mushrooming of the film industry and a very important figure in British film music was Muir Mathieson. He worked for Alexander Korda and was described by one film music composer as the "Tsar of music for British films. If you wanted to write music for films at that time you had to be 'in with Muir'. Mathieson commissioned, arranged and conducted music by Arthur Bliss, William Walton, Vaughan Williams and Malcolm Arnold and others. Among the first of these scores was Arthur Bliss's music for the 1936 film 'Things to Come' which we are playing this evening.

Also in the programme this evening is Walton's music from two of Laurence Olivier's Shakespeare adaptations from the 1940/50s, Richard III and Henry V. Olivier himself admitted that Walton's stirring music contributed greatly to the success of the films. It is worth mentioning that Mathieson spent his last years as conductor of Youth Orchestras, particularly the Oxfordshire County Youth Orchestra but also the Carlisle Youth Orchestra where I was privileged to be a tutor on one of his courses. He was actually suffering from cancer of the oesophagus at this time and died in 1975 (age 64) when he failed to regain consciousness after an operation on his throat. He had been conducting the Oxfordshire County Youth Orchestra the previous day! From the same period is the stirring march that Eric Coates wrote for the 1955 film the Dambusters.

The later 20th century is represented by three well- known composers of movie music: Italy's Ennio Morricone, famous for his Spaghetti Westerns music, America's John Williams, who has written the music for many blockbusters including Star Wars, Raiders of the Lost Ark etc and the UK's Harry Gregson-Williams whose film credits include The Kingdom of Heaven and The Chronicles of Narnia which the Youth Orchestra are playing this evening.
